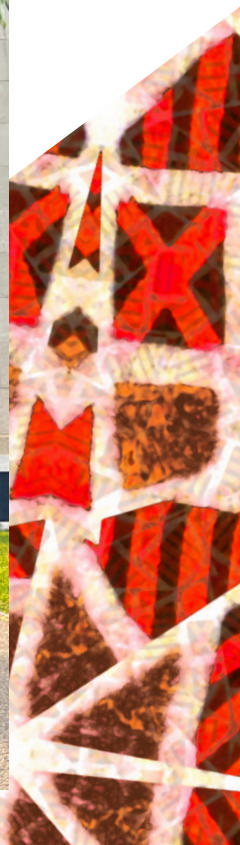


CAPSTONE: GHANA HOMECOMING
